Good afternoon everyone,



This is an official update on our current status.

We've received test results for all staff from Monday's testing and all residents from Tuesday's testing; we have **no** positive results. Unfortunately, the health department does not acknowledge the false positive of the resident that tested positive, then negative, two times after from last week. Our plan is to test all staff and residents on Monday and if all come back negative, we will be able to come off outbreak status on Wednesday.

We will continue to be in "outbreak" status. We continue to be in Phase 0; closed to admissions; all residents on precautions; staff are in full PPE; no group activities; no dining in groups; and no in facility or window visitation except for compassionate care visits are allowed. We are required to stay in Phase 0 until we have 14 days with no positive results after the last positive case.

The following is currently in place:

- We continue to check for symptoms on all residents three times a day.
- All residents are on precautions.
- All residents will be tested weekly until further notice (directed by health department).
- All staff are screened before entering the facility.
- All staff are being tested bi-weekly.
- Staff are in full PPE (personal protective equipment) on all floors at all times.
- We are closed to new admissions.
