We learned yesterday that eight residents from the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor and one from the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor have tested positive; the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor resident has been put into isolation on the annex. The 3<sup>rd</sup> floor residents will be monitored within the confines of the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor.

Due to these positive cases, we will remain in an outbreak status for another two weeks.

Visitation is still allowed however discouraged on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor. Visitors to the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor and for those residents in isolation on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor, will be asked to wear proper PPE during their visit.

## The following interventions continue to be in place:

- Staff on 4<sup>th</sup> floor are wearing a medical mask and eye protection at all times in all resident/patient care areas (full PPE for any resident(s) in isolation, N95, eye protection, gowns, gloves).
- All 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> floor staff are wearing an N95 and eye protection at all times (full PPE for any resident(s) in isolation, N95, eye protection, gowns, gloves).
- We are keeping each resident floor separated from one another.
- Residents can be out and about with a mask.
- All residents are wearing and being reminded to wear a mask when out of their room, when with a visitor, and during care, (difficult on 3<sup>rd</sup> floor).
- All residents are assessed for signs and symptoms of Covid-19, 2 times a day and if there is a noticeable change in their condition.
- We screen all staff, visitors, vendors upon entering the building.
- We are currently testing weekly all staff and residents. We are also doing an antigen test as needed for staff and residents if anything is suspected.
- At this time, due to the increase in positives on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor, we are testing all residents daily.
