Hello Everyone,

A resident on the 3rd floor tested positive today; this resident will be monitored within the confines of the 3rd floor.

Due to these positive cases, we will remain in an outbreak status for another two weeks.

Visitation is still allowed however discouraged on the 3rd floor. Visitors to the 3rd floor and for those residents in isolation on the 2nd floor, will be asked to wear proper PPE during their visit.

The following interventions continue to be in place:

- Staff on the 4th floor are wearing a medical mask and eye protection at all times in all resident/patient care areas (full PPE for any resident(s) in isolation, N95, eye protection, gowns, gloves).
- All staff on the 2nd floor, are wearing an N95 and eye protection at all times in all resident/patient care areas (full PPE for any resident(s) in isolation, N95, eye protection, gown, and gloves).
- All staff on the 3rd floor, are wearing an N95, eye protection, a gown and gloves as appropriate, at all times in all resident/patient care areas.
- We are keeping each resident floor separated from one another.
- Residents (non-COVID positive, except 3rd), on all floors can be out and about with a mask. However, on 2nd floor they are encouraged to maintain 6' distancing and are being set one per table for dining. There are no activities happening on 2nd or 3rd floor.
- All residents are wearing and being reminded to wear a mask when out of their room, when with a visitor, and during care, (difficult on 3rd floor).
- **All residents are assessed for signs and symptoms of Covid-19, 2 times a day and if there is a noticeable change in their condition.**
- **We are doing an antigen test as needed for staff and residents if anything is suspected.**
- We screen all staff, visitors, vendors upon entering the building.
